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YONGGOM (Yongom) is spoken along the Fly and Tedi (Alice) Rivers, mainly in Papua. Two villages of Yonggom speakers also

live on the shores of Lake Murray. The 19578 census figures have been analyzed to show 2,000 Yonggom speakers in Papua. It is assumed that there are very few in Irian Barat, and any that are there would have been counted above as speakers of Southern Kati, a closely related language. Yonggom word lists available include 100 words by the author from Oya No. 2, 90 words by Assistant District Officer J.W. Kent from Watakum, and 110 words by Austen from both Marapka and Ort Ambip.

This classification, however, is based on limited data and appears to be inconsistent. ... / ...

The Yonggom say they speak a single language (weng mimo), which is composed of a number of named dialects that are, for the most part, mutually intelligible. The naming of the dialects is complicated by two factors: (1) there has been extensive population movement since pacification, so that the dialects are not coterminous with discrete territories, and (2) the Yonggom names for the different dialects are sometimes used as directional terms, so that a name which connotes "the language spoken by the people to the north" is applied differently depending upon the position of the speaker. Despite these difficulties, I propose the following provisional classification of Yonggom dialects, based on a loose consensus among the speakers of the language:

(1) **Kataut**: Spoken only in the northern-most Muyu area in Irian Jaya, from Kopko to the north.

(2) **Middle Yonggom**: Spoken in the northern villages in Papua New Guinea, as well as the Lake Murray villages (Nago and Buseki). Spoken in Irian Jaya from Kawangtet to Metomka (Corresponds with South Kati).

(3) **Kabom** or **Kagaip**: In Papua New Guinea, spoken from Yogi village south to Atkamba (including Dome) and in Kawok and Moian. Extends northwest into Irian Jaya to Ninati (Corresponds with North Kati).

(4) **Ok Pari**: Spoken in the Papua New Guinea villages of Erehta, Membok, and Karengu. Also spoken in Irian Jaya from Mindiptana south along the Kao River. /

The Yonggom recognize and name additional, localized speech varieties as well. For example, the language spoken by the people who lived along the Ok Tedi River between Dome and Atkamba prior to pacification is called Derian, and is recognized as a variety of what I have referred to as Middle Yonggom. Certain language varieties are also more difficult for some people to understand than others; for example, a Kataut speaker finds it difficult to communicate with a speaker of Ok Pari. More detailed linguistic study would probably show that Yonggom language is composed of a dialect chain running roughly north to south. Currently the language is undergoing change in the direction of Middle Yonggom.

Katì is spoken by tribes living between the Kòwo (or Kao) and the Mùju Rivers, the latter being one of the tributaries of the Kòwo, itself a tributary of the Digul River. The tribes -- referred to as Muju people by the Dutch administration -- have no word in their language naming all / of them in bulk, but are called Qawti by the Jaqàj, and Ghàwisi by the Àwju. Both names can perhaps be linked with the word katì which, in the Niinatì dialect of Katì, means "real man". The language falls into a great number of dialects of which Father DRABBE describes two, i.e. the Niinatì dialect spoken on both sides of the Mùju River in and near the village of Niinatì situated on the bank of the river, and the Metòmka dialect spoken on the banks of the Kòwo (or Kao) and in all villages to the south of the village of Jiptèm, Metòmka being one of these villages. There are, however, marked local differences in the language of each village throughout the whole Katì area.

SOUTHERN KATI (Southern Muju) is spoken on the lower Moejoe River in Irian Barat by perhaps 4,000 people. The language spoken by the Kowan people on the Fly River at its westernmost point may well be a dialect of Southern Kati, but no sample of their speech is available to the author. The most detailed study of Southern Kati was that made of the Metomka dialect by Fr. P. Drabbé. . . another dialect was [studied] by Geurtjens under the name "Digoeleesch". He claimed that this dialect was spoken on the Digoel River north of the Bian River. However, this area now seems to be uninhabited and / the present location of the speakers of this dialect is unknown to the author (unless they should prove to be the Kowan people). Another specimen of Southern Kati is the list of 110 words collected by Austen from the village of Anu.

De bevolking in het stroomgebied van de Oost Digoel (ten noorden van de Kao) en de Ok Iwoer vertonen overeenkomsten zowel naar uiterlijk, kleding als oppervlakkig waarneembare gewoonten met de Moejoe bevolking in de noordelijkste Moejoekampongs w.o. Okjan. De mensen van Ikjan hebben ook contacten met de Katèmtaman en de bevolking tussen Ok Iwoer en de Oost Digoel. De taal van de Katèmkaman is goed verstaanbaar voor Moejoeërs uit Ikjan, Toemoetoe, Waroemgi e.a. noordelijke kampongs.

De Katèmkaman hebben op hun beurt weer contacten met de bevolking langs de Digoel en in de Sibilvallei. Deze bevolkingsgroepen kunnen elkaar verstaan. ...

The northern boundary is hard to define. ... For the time being it would seem correct to draw the line through Walikubun and Kwitbon.

The eastern boundary is found mainly by the Mat, Birim, Terry, and Fly rivers. The Mat is a tributary of the Birim that in turn flows into the Terry, and this is a tributary of the Fly.
